



10 Things You Can Do (On Campus) When the Lights Are Out

On March 28, 2009 at 8:30 pm, tens of millions of people around the world will turn out their lights for one hour — Earth Hour—to demonstrate their concern for our living planet and send a loud message to our leaders that they support action on climate change. Here are a few ideas for what you can do when the lights go out:

1. Organize a house concert featuring acoustic performances from campus musicians.
2. Hold a flashlight rally at a central location on campus to demonstrate your support for reduction in carbon dioxide emissions.
3. Hold a candlelight party featuring green-themed drinks and foods that are local and organic and not using plastic and Styrofoam.
4. Invite friends to an indoor or (weather permitting) outdoor camping trip. Tell scary stories, sing songs, pop popcorn and roast marshmallows over a campfire.
5. Do a marching band or acoustic performance to invite students to do activities on campus without lights.
6. Hold storytelling sessions, poetry readings or mini dramatic performances by candlelight in the dorm or at a local club or coffee house.
7. Invite friends or someone special over for a candlelight dinner using locally grown or organic ingredients.
8. Play flashlight “tag”.
9. Play charades by candlelight.
10. Organize a competition which students making drawing, comics, poetry or songs with the theme ‘we all have a role to fight against climate change’.
